
### INTRODUCTION TO GIZA

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

Surveys ancient Egyptian pharaonic civilization and material culture: pyramids, temples, tombs, settlements, and artifacts. Explores major developmental themes that defined the Egyptian state: the geographical landscape, kingship, social stratification, and religion. Follows a chronological path with excursions into Egyptian art, history, politics, religion, literature, and language (hieroglyphs). Also touches on contemporary issues of object repatriation, archaeology and cultural nationalism, and the evolution of modern Egyptology. Includes field trips to the Egyptian collections of the Peabody Museum, Harvard Semitic Museum, and the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, along with immersive 3D computer models of the Pyramids in Harvard's Visualization Center. No prior experience in Egyptology or archaeology expected.
